

SAPLING PLANTATION IN COLLEGE (29/06/2021)



AWARENESS PROGRAMME ON 'DENGUE: CAUSES AND REMEDIES' (18-09-2021)



Special Camp Report

(19-03-2022 to 25-03-2022)

Camp Venue: Shri Sadanand Math, Salod (Hirapur), Tah. & District Wardha

The department of NSS organised the Special Residential Camp at Shri Sadanand Math, Salod (Hirapur), Tah. & District Wardha between 19 and 25 March 2022 on the theme "Swacch Bhart – Swasth Bharat" with the participation of 75 students.
